# Federal Budget Update—Transfer of Flood Mitigation Assistance Funds for DHS reorganization

The Association of State Floodplain Managers (ASFPM) has recently alerted its members of a threat to the Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) Program. FEMA is transferring funds to pay for the reorganizational expenses of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). These are funds that are specifically authorized and appropriated by Congress to support flood mitigation projects. They are <u>not</u> taxpayer funds, but are obtained from flood insurance policy holder premium income.

Some states have been notified that FY02 monies will not be available for projects already approved by FEMA, and that FY03 funds may be halved.

ASFPM has issued a letter to Joe Allbaugh, FEMA Director, strongly protesting this action. The following points were made:

- That it is inappropriate to tap funds explicitly authorized for very specific purposes;
- That the proposed transfer of a total of \$10.6 million (or more?) of NFIP funds (regardless of

- whether from the NFIP or the FMA Fund) unfairly and disproportionately burdens the 4.36 million flood insurance policyholders to pay for a reorganization that affects a government agency that serves the entire U.S. population of 290 million;
- That disrupting the planning and grant cycle so dramatically will discourage communities and property owners from participating in mitigation in the future. This will result in continuing the drain on the NFIP caused by repetitive loss claims.
- That such an action does not portend well for mitigation as a priority in the new Department of Homeland Security. This was a concern of many in Congress and elsewhere during the entire debate on putting FEMA into DHS.

Flood losses continue to increase, and funds, dedicated to reducing flood losses, should be used for that purpose.




