
### **Hazard Mitigation Grant Program**



Must have a FEMA approved Hazard Mitigation Plan to be eligible for HMGP funding



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### **Planning and Project Scoping Ideas**

- H&H study for specific flood prone areas
- Master Drainage Plan
- Stormwater Master Plan
- Floodplain Management Plan
- Dam Breach Analysis
- Dam Emergency Action Plan
- Planning requirements under FEMA's Community Rating System
- Codes and Standards



# Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC)

- Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) expected to be released July or August 2024
- Applications expected to open September 2024
- Application period expected to end January 2025
- Maximum funds available per project estimated \$50M

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# Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC)

- State Set Aside Funding
  - Up to \$2 Million each year
- National Competition
  - Start your application NOW





### **Flood Mitigation Assistance(FMA)**



- NOFO expected to be released July or August 2024
  - Project scoping, Technical Assistance, Community flood mitigation projects
- Applications expected to open September 2024
- Application period expected to end January 2025





BRIC and FMA Applications submitted for \$26.8 million for numerous projects:

- Stormwater drainage plans
- Flood warning system
- Detention pond
- Replacement of bridges and drainage structures



#### Safeguarding Tomorrow Revolving Loan Fund Program (STORM)

FEMA will provide grants to eligible applicants to award lowinterest loans to communities to reduce their vulnerability to disasters, foster greater resilience and reduce disaster impacts
